I.G.I. = International Genealogical Index.

There have been enormous delays with the next issue due to the sheer volume of additional information but it is hoped that it will appear in 1988. To clear up some of the wrong impressions given in the last newsletter information has been compiled from Mrs Dorothy Nash, Mrs Val Hepworth and David Urwin.

The Federation of F.H.S. publishes 'Where to find the I.G.I.' (UK) - however it is apparent that the current situation changes almost daily so it may be better to contact your local F.H.S. or local branch of the L.D.S. The end columns are the only ones of use to the genealogist seeking to trace further information through the L.D.S. These are the BATCH number and SERIAL sheet number. The BATCH number being the most important. If this begins with a letter of the alphabet or with the numbers 725, 744, 745 or 754, this means the entry was taken from records extracted as part of the general indexing project of the L.D.S. i.e microfilming church registers etc: However, if the Batch number is composed entirely of numbers, with the third number in the sequence lower than 4 (or, more rarely, begins with an 'F', T998, T9990, 805 or 825) then the entry was taken from a form submitted by an individual member of the LDS church, in connection with their own research. These forms have been microfilmed and copies of them can be traced by quoting the Batch number & Serial sheet number. Although the forms may not contain any further information than appears on the I.G.I., they do show the name & address of the person submitting the original information and their relationship to the person listed. This could however have changed over the years as they are not up-dated at any time. Maybe this is where the EMIGRATION point arose - if the event concerned are ENGLISH records and was submitted by a descendant living abroad, then obviously "at some time between" a member of the family emigrated. The LDS church has its English headquarters at 751 Warwick Road, Solihull, West Midlands, B91 3DQ. To obtain copies of the records mentioned above, the cost is/was 25cents per page. minimum 1 dollar - write to L.D.S. Aquisitions Section, 50 East N. Temple, Salt Lake City, UTAH 84150, U.S.A. - quoting, Country, County, Surname, Christian name(s), Date, Event, Page/frame number, Batch no: & Serial sheet no:

Val Hepworth tells us that the Mormons have another source of information available, called Reciprocal Research. Obtain form (PFGS2501) Research Coordination Registration from any LDS library - fill one in for every person you are searching (you can send in as many as you like) - these are computerised and sent to all their libraries here (UK) for anyone searching for the same name - there is no charge, just an understanding that you will share any information with anyone who writes to you. Val has found relatives in Idaho & Utah by using this service.

Near the church door at Middlesmoor at the head of Nidderdale in Yorkshire is a substantial stone commemorating a trio of Metcalfs and a worthy son in law;

Abraham Metcalf of Low Riggs d. 14.3.1791 aged 88
Mary his wife d. 3.9.1791 " 85

John Spence who mar their dau Isabella on 17.6.1771

d. 10.6.1835 aged92

Isabella d. 11.2.1837 " 90

134 years between them, 1703 - 1837 separate fathers birth to daughters death. Isabella was a late child - father 44, mother 41 when she was born; she and John were married for a week short of 64 years. The long tombstone verse starts

"Ye who life's morning see
The grassy turf which covers us
Here gathered in a good old age...

Yes indeed, four people in only two generations with combined ages totalling 355 years must be something of a record. And then We mentioned this to James Medcoff when we met at our Secretaries home on 29 March and to our surprise he told us that his parents and grandparents (Medcoffs) also totalled 355 years and the record was about to fall when his father reached 96 very shortly.

From Ruth Kay, M.N.41. I can add the following to the item by Mr Boyes on Stan Laurel in the April Mecca News.

In the mid 19th century, probably about 1860, George Metcalfe and his wife Sarah moved from Hawes to Ulverston. George was a shoemaker and possibly he went to Ulverston to find work. It is known that in the 1880's he had his own business in Ulverston. George and Sarah had two daughters, Margeret (Madge) and Sarah, both born in Ulverston.

In 1884 Madge married Arthur Jefferson a successful actor/manager/playwright. Arthur Stanley (Stan Laurel) was the second of their five children, born 16th June 1890.

Sarah married John Shaw, a Dewsbury man who came to manage the local Co-op grocery store. In 1906 the Shaws maved to Batley, a year later George and Sarah joined them - taking a house in the same street. Goerge died at Batley in 1915, aged 78. Sarah died the following year.

I have some details of the children of the marriages of Madge and Arthur and Sarah and John but no more as to the origins of George and Sarah.

Oddments gleaned from Derby Record Office;

John Metcalfe, farmer son of Thomas, farmer, mar Arabella Baillie of Shirley 2.8.1856. at St Peters Derby.

Richard Metcalfe of Askrigg mar Joan Day of Foremark Derbs. on 6.4.1657 at St Werbergs, Derby.

A search of <u>Hulland Churchyard</u> revealed 10 Metcalfes all deceased between 1931 and 1984. Details can be supplied upon request.

Another found in Shirley Churchyard -Catherine Metcalfe died 29.5.1930. aged 66. Wm Ayrton Metcalfe " 31.1.1933 aged 74.

Charities and Poor Relief - Leeds in the 16/17th Cent.- J.Metcalfe.

Several months ago I received from Nina, a bundle of items suitable for inclusion in the newsletter, amongst these were 3 photocopied pages headed "Charities and Poor Relief". From whom they were originally received I do not know but thank whoever it was. There is a pencilled note on the second page "Copied from War Plague and Trade in Leedes in the 17th Century by Steven Burt and Kevin Grady". I have extracted the details relating to John Metcalfe, Bailiff.

"During the 16th and early 17th centuries Parliament passed many Acts to encourage people to give money for charitable purposes such as Almshouses and schools and to oblige parishes to care for the Poor. As a group these became known as the Tudor or Elizabethan Poor Law. In the early 17th century a great row broke out in Leeds over the misuse of the towns charitable funds and in 1620 King James appointed commissioners to investigate. Their first report and orders for the reform of the towns charities "The First Decree for a committee of Pious-Uses in Leedes" gives a wonderfully detailed picture of Leeds charities in 1620.

They reported that during the reigns of Elizabeth 1 and James 1 considerable sums of money, lands and building had been given for charitable purposes in the town and parish. These included the repair of highways, educating children and maintaining the Parish Church. Much had also been given for the aid of the poor. Here at once corruption was discovered and John Metcalfe bailiff of the Manor of Leeds was the villian of the piece. The building of the Moot Hall in Briggate in 1615 had been paid for out of funds given for Poor Relief on condition that the rents should go to the needy. In fact the Comm-

...Commission found that only £15 out of the £20 rental had so been used for the last two years, the £5 for the upper rooms had gone straight into Metcalfe's pocket. This was not all. Metcalfe had also disregarded the custom that the corn he collected as a toll at the towns markets (The Toll Dish) should be divided three ways between himself, the repair of the market place and the poor. Since 1617 the tolls of 8 or 9 shillings a week had all gone into his pocket. Metcalfe was ordered to pay back £10 arrears, and was forced to pay the committee the arrears on the Toll Dish of £37.18s.8d. and in future the toll of corn was to be collected by two people, one representing the bailiff and the other the Commission of Pious-Uses.

Metcalfe also fell foul of the local Vicar, Alexander Cooke, a fierce Puritan who was unpopular with some of his parishioners. On his own admission he would denounce members of the parish from the pulpit, (as this is a family journal I will not repeat the names here,) He regularly sought to bring parishioners to book for moral offences etc. In these activities Metcalfe came to his attention. In 1619 he presented Metcalfe for failing to attend Church and later led an attack on him over the misuse of charitable funds. In 1622 Metcalfe hit back by filing a complaint in the Court of the Star Chamber alleging that the Vicar was defaming his character by reciting a rhyme accusing Metcalfe of Immorality and Corruption. Though the complaint was probably unsuccessful the evidence presented shows Metcalfe had attempted to stir up popular opinion against the Vicar with some success. The highlight had been his encouragement of a rush bearing ceremony in the Church on St.Bartholomews Day 1619. By tradition rushes and garlands were carried into Church to decorate it, an event normally accompanied by much drinking and merrymaking. Knowing the Vicar hated such ceremonies, Metcalfe had hired a drummer to beat a drum in the parish a full week before the ceremony to encourage a very large attendance. In the event many non-parishioners in addition to Leeds people came to enjoy the the fun. In the drunken revels that followed, a door of the Church had been broken open and a man wearing a visor and rams horns had danced about during the service, amidst the abandonment of the service the Vicar was threatened by the crowd and in return he assaulted a member of the congregation. Clearly these were turbulent times and the Vicar felt almost constantly under threat and told the Star Chamber that it was his habit to wear loaded pistols and a dagger for his owm protection."

Perhaps we have a descendant of John Metcalfe in the Society who can tell us more of the life and times of this "colourful" character. I'm sure it would be an interesting read.


