HELP WANTED

Mrs Shirley Withers, 23 Malcolm Street, West Perth, 6005, Western Australia asks if anyone knows of anyone descended from Isabella, born 1857, John, born 1860 or Alfred born 1861, of Settle.

Mr W.S.Metcalfe, 1, Macfarlane Close, Impington, Cambridge CB4 4IZ is trying to trace the place of birth of his g.g.grandfather Thomas Metcalfe who married Mary Winsby (born 1780) at Leyburn on 30th June, 1800. The 1841 Census Returns record Thomas's age as being 59, so he was probably born in the Wensleydale area between 1780 and 1782. Thomas and Mary subsequently settled in Gawshaw, Booth, Lancs. where he was a tailor.

Mr Metcalfe has found a number of Thomas Metcalfes (listed below) who were baptised in the period concerned, and is anxious to eliminate by means of an alternative marriage, a prior death or any other information available, those Thomas Metcalfes who did not marry Mary Winsby in 1800.

He asks if anyone has any information on any of the above, which could help him in his quest, or, alternatively access to Parish Registers, which may help in the process of elimination.

Mr Roland Metcalfe, 6 Westcott Drive, Durham Moor, Durham City, asks if anyone can give any information on one of his family John Metcalfe, born in Swaledale who married Mirella Buxton about 1900.

HELP OFFERED

Mr J.C.Metcalfe, 1167, Dorchester Avenue, Ottawa, Ontario, K1Z 8E3, Cana da, whilst researching on his own a ccount, turned up the following information which he thought may be os some help to some other member.

An old issue of the Quebec Gazette (est. 1764) reports in 1809 that there was an E. Metcalf in Quebec City, an artist who advertised himself as a 'Profile Oainter' He was soliciting clients in an ad. 15th June 1809.

A Mr Metcalf was a passenger on the Brig 'Eliza' which a rrived in the Port of Quebec from Liverpool on 31st October 1816.

Francis Metcalf, arrived in Canada in the early summer of 1815 and was granted land in Upper Canada, 12th August, 1815. He had served in the 90th Regiment of Foot, a veteran of war service in England about 9 years.

Another military Metcalf in that early period in Canada was William Metcalff (sic) who was recorded as being unfit for service in 1813 (during the war of 1812/3 and 14 between Canada and the then young United States of America. It seems that he either contracted a disease, or was wounded and sent back to England on October 12th 1813, from Quebec as 'nnfit for duty' and returned to England 'for the purpose of being invalided (to the Chelsea Hospital?) Royal Artillery, 10th R.V.B. Edward Baynes, Adjutant General.

Miss Flora A. Metcalfe, Apt. 812 Park Place, 470 George St., South, Peterborough, Ontario, K9J 3E4, Canada has received the following information from someone she has been corresponding with in Australia.

"With regard to the Metcalfe line, I did check every list of members in the Queensland Genealogical Society; the published papers of the Victorian Genealogical Conference 1980; Australasian Genealogical Directory 1981; Nepean Family History Society (N.S.W.); as well as local sources. The only mention of the name was in the computor printout of the index to the Darling Downs Gazette in which I found:

METCALFE Evelyn James, married Isobel Taylor, 23rd April 1889 in Toowoomba. Isobel, daughter of James Taylor, died June 1890, in Toowoomba. Evelyn James married Prudence Brodribb 4th January, 1893, in Toowoomba, the groom, Evelyn James Metcalfe shown as a son of Colonel Metcalfe.

The James Taylor, who became Evelyn James Metcalfe's first fatherin-law was a pioneer of the area, later becoming Hon. James Taylor, Member of the Legislative Council of Queensland. They have links with early Colonial history through the Lethbridge family. Mary Inthrbidge, one of Australia's early settlers, married Phillip Gidley King, 4th Governor of the Colony. Evelyn James Metcalfe's second wife, Prudence Brodribb was also of a prominent family, one which is still known in the area."

If anyone is interested in this particular Metcalfe family please contact Miss F.A. Metcalfe, as her Australian friend is willing to research further.

A VISIT TO THE GENEALOGICAL LIBRARY, HUDDERSFIELD.

Earlier this year your Secretary and Treasurer went on an organised visit to the Genealogical Library of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (Mormon) near Huddersfield. Our instructions were simply to meet at the building if we wished to join in the visit, and as 7.15 p.m. approached, no less than fifty-five people were assembled, sardine-like, in the entrance hall! The number seemed to surprise everyone, and extra chairs were hurriedly sought as we were shepherded along the corridor and into a room for a talk and film show. A few members had to stand, but the film was very interesting and not too long.

We were told of the continuing collection of records which, for the past 40 years, Mormon genealogical experts have been micro-filming throughout the world.

Then came pictures of the Granite Mountain vaults, which have been constructed to house the micro-film records, protected from the violences of earth and man.

High in the Rocky Mountains, just south of Salt Lake City, Route 210 climbs up Little Cottonwood Canyon, where a drive hairpins to the main entry tunnel, which leads straight into the heart of the mountain and to a grid of six arched vaults containing thousands of steel filing cabinets. A 14-ton steel door seals the main tunnel and the vaults are protected by 700 ft. of granite.

At the Headquarters Library in Salt Lake City positive prints of each roll of the vast collection are available for anyone to consult without charge, supplemented by thousands of genealogical reference books, periodicals and printed histories of families and places.

After the film we were divided into groups to be shown the library area which is comparatively small, consisting of a staff/storage room opening into an area with benches and microfilm readers. Because of the large number of us on this occasion, we were not able to do any research.

Arranged by County and surname includes 17,000,000 christenings and 2,500,000 marriages from Parish Registers.

There are some other records available on the premises, but other material such as Census Records, Bishops transcripts, Probate Records etc. may be ordered for viewing at the library.

- (1) Those which are a record of whole Parishes put in under a controlled extract programme have a prefix of P, C, M OR 725, 745 OR 754.
- (2) Entries from individuals since 1969 have a prefix with its 3rd digit smaller than 4 e.g. 730 9309.
