The following account has been sent to us by Mr J.W. Metcalfe of Stockport. It is taken from the book "Broad Acres" a Yorkshire Miscellany by Alfred J. Brown, first published 1948.

The Metcalfes of Nappa and the reason for the Siege of Raydale - The Last Private War in England.

In 1617 Sir Thomas Metcalfe, known as the Black Knight of Nappa, because of his dark features, was financially embarrassed. The Metcalfes had been in possession of Nappa Hall since the middle of the 15th century. James Metcalfe took part in the French campaigns of 1415 and was a captain at Agincourt. In return for his services Sir Richard Scrope gave him land and built Nappa Hall. Succeeding Metcalfes attained high honours in the state and rendered valuable service in the various campaigns. They became wealthy landowners and were, in fact, an exceptionally large clan. It is on record that one Sir Christopher Metcalfe, on his appointment to the position of High Sherriff of Yorkshire in 1555 attended at York with three hundred horsemen, all his kith and kin, on white horses. They were the largest English clan to fight at Flodden Field. Alas, it was Sir Christopher who caused the family fortunes to be squandered in riotous living and it was he who renounced the faith of his fathers at the Reformation, though the Metcalfes had always been pronounced catholics in Wensleydale. In July 1610 Sir Thomas Metcalfe, his son, mortgaged his Raydale property to one William Robinson of Worton in consideration of a payment of £1,000. Sir Thomas, however, wished to remain in possession of the house for six years so undertook to pay Robinson a rent of £100 per annum and had the option of redeeming the mortgage on payment of a further sum of £1,000 within 6 years. Had he done so there would have been no siege, but Sir Thomas Metcalfe never paid a penny of either rent or capital!! At the expiration of the six years therefore, the patient Robinson took proceedings to recover possession. Being successful in the action Robinson entered Raydale House on the 26th March. On the 20th April Sir Thomas Metcalfe's bailiff ejected him. Robinson brought action against the bailiff for trespass and the case came up at York Assizes in July 1616. The verdict was in favour of Robinson. It was not until May the following year that Robinson was put in formal possession of Raydale by the sherriff. The bitterly disappointed Sir Thomas let Robinson know that he would recover by Club Law what he had lost by Common Law.

TAKEN FROM THE MINUTES OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COURT OF THE STAR CHAMBER.

On Wednesday 4th June 1617, three weeks after Robinson had obtained possession, Sir Thomas with 60 men armed with muskets calivers, pikes, javelins, long bow and arrows, came before the house in the evening. They discharged their guns as soon as they came and presently sent a summons to those within to deliver up the possession, to which they (Robinson) answered that if they had the authority for it they were ready to do so. Otherwise they would waste their lives. Hereupon Sir Thomas began the Siege of the House. They gave many assaults upon it and in one hour shot through the house 17 times. The Siege continued from Wednesday until the following Saturday when troops arrived with Sergeant at Arms from York. One of the Metcalfe band said Hodson was killed from a shot from the house. Sir Thomas was compelled to withdraw.

By a series of protracted lawsuits in the Court of Chancery touching a question of bonds and by further dubious mortgages, Sir Thomas managed, untimately, to put the Robinsons in difficulties and in March 1621 Sir Thomas obtained a full pardon and release for himself and his associates with all fines remitted

which had been imposed. Robinson, however, retained possession of Raydale House.

The Raydale episode is the one blot on the family escutcheon, for the Metcalfes had rendered yeoman service to king and country for three hundred years, both in the field and in the service of the state.

Mary Queen of Scots is said to have paid Sir Christopher a visit at Nappa Hall during her imprisonment at Castle Bolton.

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Mrs Pat Russell of Chester (Member No. 21) came across the following while browsing through 'The Lake Counties' ed. by Arthur Mee in "The King's England" series.

It is more than time that John Peel's real immortaliser should have his share of fame. He was William Metcalfe, a Norwich man, who for 50 years sang in the choir of Carlisle Cathedral and who was conductor of the Carlisle Choral Society. It was in 1868 that he heard John Peel sung to the old rant of Bonnie or Cannie Annie, and at once realised what a rollicking song could be based on this air. He sang his own version at an important dinner in London the next year, and it was met with wild enthusiasm. From that time it was Metcalfe's version which was sung; it is his song we sing today, and he who would make a pilgrimage to the man who most fame to the name of John Peel must go to Carlisle, where William Metcalfe was laid to rest in 1909.

Now surely one of us must be a descendent of this 'famous' Metcalfe. Any offers?
